The process will include the defining the parameters of strategic priorities by Council and a statewide engagement process to solicit input/feedback from partners, interest groups and the general public on what should be considered as priorities. OERP staff are coordinating synthesis of information about relevant strategic plans and priorities that already exist as context/background for Council’s consideration and will provide Council with that synthesis as well as a synthesis of all public input before deliberating on the first set of strategic priorities. This process will formally begin at the May 6, 2026, OERC meeting with a goal of concluding in September or October 2026. <i>Information item.</i></p>

Rulemaking will begin as soon as the draft rules are finalized. OERP staff will be engaging with each Tribe in April to identify a set of reporting requirements as directed by the legislation. <i>Information item.</i></p>
